# Creating a Place of Discovery

The Partnership for 21st Century Skills, a national educational reform organization, describes a number of criteria that students will need in the future to be successful participants in society. Besides the usual reading, writing and math skills, it advocates the four Cs of critical thinking and problem solving, communication, collaboration, and creativity and innovation. We will blend the library's collection of print, visual and downloadable materials in the Discovery Zone with active involvement using the four Cs.

### This unique Discovery Zone will

inspire enduring curiosity and love of learning in children. Quiet areas for reading will be balanced with active, children-involved centers for group participation. Whether doing a homework assignment or researching a new way to explore the universe, children can choose to interact in an environment appealing to all learning styles.

# A custom designed early literacy

area will incorporate interactive elements to address the learning needs of children ages birth to 5, reinforcing caregiver communication, introducing books, words and letters, and teaching the seven pre-literacy skills. The Early Literacy Centers are comprised of museum quality units, which include seating, books and custom-designed, open-ended activities that support the pre-reading skills.
